A 1955 Brother Has Departed

On November 5, 2012, Brother John Ellis Williams M.D. entered Chapter Eternal. Dr. Williams lived in Long Beach, MS, having been born and raised in Jackson, MS. He graduated from Central High School and USM, then Mississippi Southern College.

He received his medical degree from the University of Mississippi Medical Center in Jackson. A decorated Navy veteran of the Viet Nam War, he completed a general surgery residency at the U.S. Navy Hospital in St. Albans, NY and later served as a surgeon with the First Marine Division at Da Nang, Viet Nam, where he received the Bronze Star for outstanding service.

Discharged in 1971, he settled in Long Beach, joined the staff of Gulfport Memorial Hospital and became Chief of Surgery until 1993 when he closed his medical practice, but remained on staff in the Emergency and Hyperbarics departments until final retirement in 1999.

A world traveler, Brother Williams, often pursued his passion for big game hunting, fishing and of telling a good story or two.

As a Delta Mu PIKE, John was in and of himself a story.

As Brother Art Mellen, a close friend of John then and over the years, recalls because of a friendship with a Southern Miss professor's son, David Miller, the summer job migration of Delta Mu PIKES began up to Karamac Lodge in the Poconos. First being Billy Thompson, Bruce Stewart and John. Followed by Art, David (Lumpy) Loposer, Billy Paul Stewart, Frank Betts, William Risher, Gabor Ketting and Jack Cistriano.

John played the trombone at the Karamac Lodge (NJ) in the evenings. Served as the waiter for two assigned tables. In a subtle hint, before serving his two tables he would let the patrons know that they were solely his responsibility and that he was working to save up to buy a microscope for Med School.

Though required to dance, as were all waiters, no one can recall ever seeing John fulfill that explicit duty.
