It is with great pleasure I am able to announce our new *Delta Mu Review* alumni newsletter. Our hope as an alumni association is that this newsletter will strengthen our communication efforts and connect alumni of all decades by providing information and updates from brothers on a biannual basis.

We had an extremely successful convention this past July with over 100 attendees between our Friday night social, Saturday meeting, and golf tournament at the Gulf Hills Hotel and Conference Center in Ocean Springs. New to our function was a ritual continuing education session led by Brother Tony Cain '65, which provided a "back-to-basics" approach as a foundation to our gathering. Additionally, Brother Ron Davis '68 educated the general membership on the importance of our Order of 1949 program and was successful in signing up several new members at the convention.

We would like to give a special thanks to Tony Cain for his fantastic job as president of our association and to **Bill Kortman '63** for his position as treasurer these last two years. You can see the list of new alumni association board members at the bottom of this page.

If you have not been able to previously, please plan on attending one of our future events and help our numbers grow with each passing year. Our annual convention has provided brothers who haven't seen each other for many years an easy way to plan an annual visit, no matter the hectic schedules we all fight each day. This function also allows the alumni association to report on the prior year's financials and net income, which was \$6,734 for the 11-month period. Additionally, we can now report that the net income from our convention month of July 2016 shows \$1,918, for a total annual net income of \$8,652.

As the fall of 2016 takes stride, it is with extreme importance we continue to connect the decades of Delta Mu alumni all the way back to our founding in 1949. The progress we have made is tremendous, but we still have a lot of work to do if we are to accomplish our goal of reactivating the Delta Mu Chapter by the fall of 2017. This timeline of one year will pass very quickly and we need your support. The National Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha as well as the University of Southern Mississippi has stated that a strong alumni association in this situation can make all the difference in the world toward the success of this process. Born Cousins, Made Brothers

Dale '97 and Armond "Arny" Gollott III '99 Share Pike Memories and Family Success



or Dale '97 and Armond "Arny" Gollott III '99, nothing is more meaningful than family. As cousins, they had been close since childhood, and it was no surprise that both would find a home in Delta Mu Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha. "It was my family away from home," Dale said. For Arny, "Once Dale was there and loved it, there was never an option as to what I would do when I made it to USM the next year."

The sense of family Delta Mu had already provided Dale was further strengthened through Arny's membership in the fraternity. "I couldn't wait to share the experience with him. One of my proudest moments was his initiation," Dale said. Through Delta Mu, they were part of a brotherhood that pushed them to achieve their goals and grow as collegians. "Each passing year, the fraternity meant more to me," Arny said.

The friends Dale and Arny made through Pi Kappa Alpha have made a substantial impact on their lives. Many of Arny's brothers continue to serve as role models, especially **Ron Savell '95**. After the devastation of 9/11, Ron sprung into action to help those affected. "He thought of and organized a collection effort for first responders and we raised over \$50,000 within a few short days," Arny said. "To this day, Ron and his businesses are active and I know they have helped a great deal in the recent Louisiana flood disaster."

Since graduation, both Dale and Arny have remained close to their Delta Mu brothers. "A majority of the guys I spend time with and who stood in my wedding were Delta Mu Pikes," Dale said. He sees brothers nearly every week, whether it be for a child's birthday, Christmas party, or simply for dinner.

Not only are Dale and Arny cousins and Delta Mu brothers, they are the fourth generation of Gollotts working in the seafood industry. "Our great-grandfather started our family business, C.F. Gollott & Son's Seafood, in 1932," Arny explained. In the past 80 years, the company has grown to be the largest shrimp processor in Mississippi and one of the largest processors of domestic shrimp in the United States. "People always ask if we're crazy for being in business together," Dale said, "but if you ask any of us, we'll all tell you a version of the same thing, 'That's our strength.""

Dale and Arny are extremely proud of the success their family's business has achieved over the years and the pride they have for their company is only outmatched by their love of fatherhood. Dale and his wife, Vivyan, have two daughters, Annabelle Grace (6) and Caroline Faith (2). "To watch their personalities develop and see them achieve their own small, personal milestones and goals under the influence and encouragement of my wife and I are some of my proudest moments," Dale shared. In October, Arny, his wife, Jamie Rae, and their 8-year-old son, Arny IV, are expecting a new addition to their family, Faith Rae. He is tremendously proud of his family and all they have accomplished.

When they aren't busy running their family's company, Dale and Arny spend a great deal of time outdoors, with their family, and attending sporting events. Dale enjoys adventurous activities and is a certified pilot, scuba diver, and boat captain, and Arny continues to cheer on the Golden Eagles, hunt, and study history.
